## The late Fred William Wood

The community was saddened with the passing away of Fred Wood at the Barrie Memorial Hospital on Thursday, August 15, 1991. He was in his 95th year.

A life-long resident of the Powerscourt Community, Fred was born and raised on the farm just west of the covered bridge. His father and mother were the late Thomas Wood and Margaret Thompson. He was the surviving member of his family, as one brother and two sisters pre-deceased him.
