At the time of her death she was treasurer and Chairman of the Heart Fund Committee. She served her Grand Chapter as Grand Representative and worked

on committees. She will be greatly missed.

Evelyn was a devoted member of St-Luke's Anglican Church and a faithful member of the A.C.W. where she served as secretary-treasurer for over 25 years.
