There, she shared her skills in quilting and other handcrafts, many of which were given to charities. When it closed she was a regular and faithful member of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Huntingdon, as long as able.

Verna is survived by her brother Keith Durward of Malone, his family and several nieces and nephews, as well as the devoted children they helped to raise.

1992's Baby

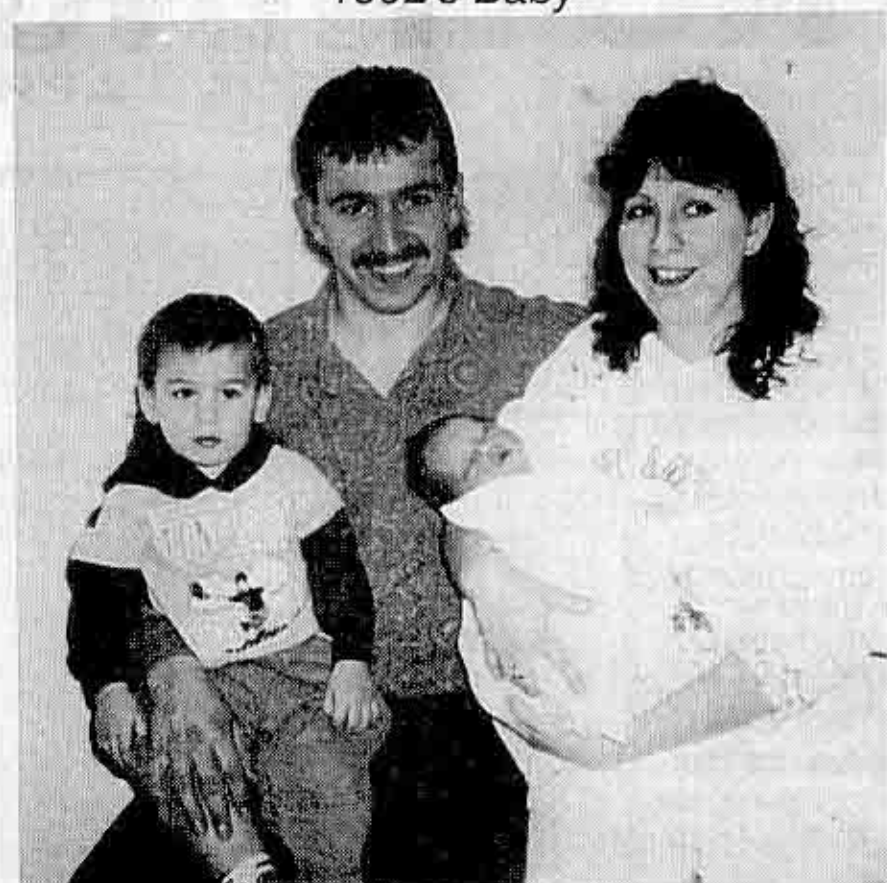
