## Martin Dineen fondly remembered

Rarely can it be said of any man that he was genuinely loved and respected by all who knew him, but such a man was the late Martin Dineen, life-long resident of Huntingdon and well-known dairy farmer in this area.

Since his death Tuesday, Jan. 21, at the Valleyfield hospital, even strangers have come forward to express their affection for the man whose friendly smile and wave buoyed them as they passed by the farm on Plank Rd.

Martin, son of Michael Dineen and Ellen Curran, was born on Sept. 6, 1917, at the family farm which his father had purchased in 1912. As a young man following in his father's footsteps, he made a name for himself as a breeder of Holsteins, culminating in the award of Master Breeder.

In 1946, he married Mary McDonagh of Huntingdon, at St. Joseph's church. The couple had two sons, Harold and Austin, who became the third generation on the family farm. A year and a half ago, in August, 1990, Martin was devastated by the loss of his beloved wife of 44 years.

Besides his two sons, the deceased leaves to mourn his

passing his daughter-in-law, Sarah; three grand-children, Patrick, Danny and Sabrina, and his sister, Helen Cosgrove; also many nieces and nephews.

A Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Father Gabriel Clement, assisted by Father Marcell, on Jan. 23 at St. Joseph's church, with burial in the parish cemetery. Pallbearers were Johnny Cosgrove, James Cosgrove, Ronnie Dineen, Kenny McDonagh, Patrick Lambert, and Glenn Pringle, all nephews.

Parishioners of St. Joseph's remember Martin as a

Christian gentleman and a tireless worker for his church and community, performing the duties of church warden during the sixties; taking on the job of cutting the grass in the parish cemetery; donating calves to the annual parish auction, and attending, with his wife, countless parish and community functions.

A life-long breeder of Holstein cows, Martin hosted the Barn Meeting for members of the Huntingdon-Ormstown Holstein Club in April 1980. Animals in his herd received several awards for lifetime production and, in April, 1991, he was awarded the elite honor of Master Breeder at the annual meeting of the Holstein Association of Canada, in Kingston, Ont.

A happy man who made others happy, Martin's passing will leave an emptiness in the community that will be hard to fill.
