Hattie received her education at the Shearer School at the corner of the 1st Concession and Shearer Side Road, then spent many years as house keeper for numerous area families, then returned home to run the family farm and care for her parents.

She was admired by all who knew her, when at age 55 she purchased her first car, a new Volkswagen bug, and took driving lessons from a friend.

Her pleasant and spunky

nature kept her active and healthy, well into recent years, while living alone in her new bungalow, following the fire which razed the family home in 1963.

When moving from her home several years ago, she resided at the pleasant Harrigan Home in Huntingdon then moved to Rockburn where her final months were spent at the Farquhar home, where she received excellent loving care from June and her staff.
