Former Franklin native Clifford Pennington passes

T. Clifford Pennington, age 92, formerly of Camden, N.Y., died Wednesday morning (9/23) at the Stonchedge Nursing Home, Rome, where he had resided since May 1989.

Surviving Mr. Pennington are two sons, David Pennington of Rome, N.Y., and James Pennington of High Point, N.C., two daughters, Gartha Gabriel of Liverpool, N.Y. and Melda Seccore of Bridgeport, N.Y., 12 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

Mr. Pennington was born in Franklin Center, April 10, 1900, son of Benjamin and Adah Wheatley Pennington.

He attended schools at Valleyfield, and moved to Ogdensburg, N.Y. in 1930. He married Eva Hilchie at Franklin Center, Quebec on Jan. 18, 1932.

Mr. Pennington was a fireman at the Ogdensburg State Hospital and later worked at the Hermon Cheese Factory, Hermon, N.Y., where Mr. and Mrs. Pennington lived following their marriage. Mr. and Mrs. Pennington moved to Camden in 1940, and Mr. Pennington was employed at Revere Brass & Copper in Rome, N.Y. from 1942, until retiring in 1960. Mrs. Pennington died Oct. 16, 1986.
