## Teacher Primeau was "second mother"

Denise Lavoie Bailey  
Primeau, a Grade 4 teacher  
at Centennial Park School,  
died in her sleep last Sunday  
night. She was 51.

Ms. Primeau formerly  
taught at Billings before  
teaching six-plus classes at  
Ormstown Elementary for  
13 years. She asked for a  
transfer to Chateauguay this  
year because, as one confrère  
put it, "the driving was get-  
ting to her."

Ian Rennie, principal of  
Ormstown Elementary for  
most of the time Denise spent

there, called her "a hubby,  
effervescent person who as a  
great asset in the staffroom.  
Around the school she was a  
happy person who would  
cheer people up when she  
saw them frowning".

"In the classroom she was  
like a second mother to most  
kids," Rennie recalls. She  
was a dedicated teacher who  
loved her six-plus classes,  
and that was where she  
shone. Denise was someone  
who always wanted to get  
involved. She'll be greatly  
missed."

About 108 people who had  
direct contact with a five-  
year-old Huntingdon Acad-  
emy kindergarten student  
who died last Friday of men-  
ingitis are being treated with  
antibiotics and will be vac-  
cinated against the disease.

Academy principal Fred  
Hutchings convened a pub-  
lic information meeting  
Sunday afternoon at the  
school with parents of  
Academy and St. Joseph  
students and the representa-  
tives of the Department of  
Community Health (DSC)  
in Valleyfield. For about 2  
hours parents questioned  
director Dr. Jocelynn  
Suavé, who was accom-  
panied by colleague Dr. Louise  
Lambert, infectious disease  
specialist, about any risks  
their children might be fac-  
ing.
