Stanley Cooke mourned by many in Valleyfield

The Valleyfield English Community was greatly saddened by the death of one of its oldest citizens, Stanley Cooke, who passed away on December 20, 1992 at Le Centre Hospitalier de Valleyfield, after a long battle with cancer.

The funeral Mass was held at 2 p.m., Tuesday, December 22, at Sacre Coeur Church, Valleyfield, and was attended by many old friends and former colleagues along with family members. They came to give their last farewell, and offer condolences to the bereaved family.

He was laid to rest in the Valleyfield Catholic Cemetery.

Stanley was born in Valleyfield on January 27, 1909. He was the son of George Ernest Cooke and Clara Drefield, former emigrants from England.

The house where he was born no longer exists. It stood where the Valleyfield Presbyterian Church now stands

on Dufferin Road (opposite the Woolco).

Stanley attended the Gault Institute. After his graduation from Grade 12, he obtained a position in the old Montreal Cottons, Main Office, where he eventually was promoted to the position of Paymaster, a position he held until his retirement, at which time he had completed 49 years of devoted service.

He was also appointed as Head Librarian at the old "MOCO" Club.

On April 17, 1937 he married Marguerite Poirier, daughter of Napoleon Poirier and Beriza Roy.

In 1943 the couple became proud parents with the arrival of their only child, Lorraine.

Stanley will be sadly missed by so many people in this Community.
