## Former V'field resident Leslie Herbert Bole dies

It is with great sadness the Valleyfield community has learned of the sudden death of Leslie Herbert Bole on Friday, April 2, 1993 while visiting in Longueuil.

Leslie who was born in Montreal in 1914, had retired as manager of Marine Industries, Sorel, where he worked in the management department for his entire working life.

Les and his wife Joan (who was born in Devon, England), were married in Chambly, Que. on June 17, 1939, and were blessed with three children: Richard, Kenneth and Barbara.

The family moved to Valleyfield in 1949, and took up residence on Gault St., where they stayed until 1958. They became highly respected members of this Community.

Leslie, on loan from Marine Industries, was assigned to supervising plans and operations for the new St. Lawrence Seaway, working on shipping and dredging operations.

The children attended Gault Institute, where in later years daughter Barbara became a teacher, instructing her own children also.

The family were devoted members of St. Mark's Anglican Church, and made many friends over the years.

Leslie was also an ardent "Ham Radio" operator right up until his untimely death. His code signals were VE2-YP and VE3X-YP.

The funeral service was held at 11 a.m. April 6, with cremation at Capital Memorial Gardens, Ottawa, where they have resided since Leslie's retirement from Marine Industries.
