Obituary

Douglas R.W. Templeton was man of many interests

Doug took a tremendous interest in life--in everybody and everything about him.

The people and events that filled his life gave it meaning and brought him great pleasure. Family and relatives, friends and neighbours were important to him and his wide-ranging interests made his circle of friendship a very big one.

He prided himself on finding the extraordinary in an ordinary world, giving the ordinary special meaning. It might be the dozen hens that laid 13 eggs in one day or an unusual item retrieved from the past that would be shown with pride. a gifted story-teller, Doug could relate a story from bygone days, bringing it to life with significant detail, sharing the laughter with his listeners.

Doug enjoyed many activities. His interests included antique cars, competing and judging at local fairs, training oxen, curling with the Seniors, driving a horse,

collecting antiques, playing euchre. He was a keen competitor, but a good-natured one. He was a good judge of dairy cattle and a lover of horseflesh, reflecting his love of farming. His family was always of utmost importance and loving concern to him.

Douglas Robert William Templeton was born February 20, 1919, second son of Marjory Thompson and Wallace Templeton of Riverfield, Québec. His brothers and sisters were James, Donald, Earle, Betty, Murray and Jean.

Doug launched his own career as a farmer in his early 20s with the purchase of the "Stewart place with the windmill", on the highway near Riverfield. In 1945 he married Marjorie Hooker; they had four children: Carolyn, Lorne whose accidental death in 1965 was a tragic loss, Ralph and Roy. The family tree expanded with marriage and grandchildren: Carolyn and Lachlan--Nancy, Elen, and Ashley; Ralph and

Debbi--Kasinee and Brett; Roy and Lynn--Jeffrey, Bethany and Darren.

Doug's sudden passing on April 24, 1993, at age 74, saddened the community and his many friends everywhere. The funeral service in Howick United Church was conducted by Rev. Beverley Burlock who paid tribute to the life of Douglas Templeton and offered the comfort of God's blessings to us in time of sorrow. "Come let us sing of a wonderful love," and "Take time to be holy" were sung. Six of Doug's nephews were the pallbearers: Bruce Barr, Brent Hooker, Bruce MacFarlane, Brian Tannahill, Alec Templeton, and Scott Templeton. Following the service, interment was at Riverfield Cemetery.
