The late Leslie F. Sherry was born in Huntingdon, Que. on September 22, 1911, the son of William J. Sherry and Elizabeth Whittall, and eldest grandchild of Frances and Mary Sherry. His early life was spent on his father's farm on the Connaught Road.

After marrying Elsie McLean in 1937, he moved to the farm on New Erin Road. He farmed and served the community as an electrical contractor for over 20 years.

Elsie and Leslie had five children, and their home was always open to family, friends, neighbors, and relatives. They were married over 50 years.

Leslie enjoyed people, and he enjoyed life, and he was always ready to reminisce. He could talk for hours about the unwritten love of life on the farm and the early
