Elsie Connor, 93, of V'field mourned by friends, family

The Valleyfield community has been greatly saddened by the sudden death of one of its oldest citizens.

Elsie Connor, (née Amos), died suddenly on Sunday, Dec. 19 1993, at the age of 93.

Elsie had been a patient in Le Centre Hospitalier de Valleyfield for just a few days at the time of her death.

The funeral service was held at 2 p.m., Tuesday, Dec. 21 at St. Mark's Anglican Church, Valleyfield.

Many old family friends attended the service to say their last

goodbyes, and offer condolences to her family members.

Elsie was born in 1900, in Tring, (near London, England). She was the daughter of the late George Amos, and Mary Tyrell.

In 1906 her family, including Elsie and sister Dolly, emigrated to Montreal. Shortly thereafter, they moved to Valleyfield, where her father, George, became manager of the old MacDonald & Robb Co. in Valleyfield.

In 1920, Elsie married the late Herbert Thomson in St. Mark's Anglican Church, Valleyfield. (Herbert was also from England).

The couple were blessed with three sons and one daughter: Sydney, Herbert and Doreen. (one son, Robert died at a young age).

Sadly, Herbert died some years ago, and more recently Elsie married Philip Connor of Valleyfield, who also predeceased her.

Over the years Elsie

was an active member of the Valleyfield English community. She was a staunch member of St. Mark's Church and the Friendship Club. Some years ago she was also President of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Valleyfield Royal Canadian Legion.

She will be sadly missed by all. Deepest sympathy is extended to her remaining family members: sons: Sid Thomson, his wife, Irene (née Wallace), and their children, Scott and Heather, all of Amherstburg, Ont.; Herbie, his wife, Kathleen (née Lockwood), and their children Brenda, Kendall, Kevin and Randy, all of St. Timothée; and her daughter, Doreen, (Ian Potts), and their children, Tracy, Donald and Jennifer, all of Kitchener, Ont.; also to her remaining sister, Dolly DeLuca, of Valleyfield; her brother, George, of Utica, N.Y. and her many half-brothers and sisters in this area.
