Andrew James
McGerrigle (Andy) was
born in Ormstown on
August 21, 1904, the son
of James and Sarah
McGerrigle. He had two
brothers, Douglas (who

He was educated at Ormstown Academy and McGill University. He was active in sports, especially running.

During his teaching career which was spread over 34 years, he taught in many parts of Quebec. His favorite and most rewarding experience was at Grenville. Here he encouraged Country singer Ronnie Prophet to start a musical career which still continues. Andy believed in active participation insports and development of one's talents.

In 1950 he married Mary Baugh. He and his wife adopted a readymade family of three who made their life fuller and richer. Andy retired in 1964 and returned to live in Ormstown. He played an active role as town councillor, Lion's Club member, and co-founder of Walshaven for seniors.

He died on Friday, Mar. 11 at the Barrie Memorial Hospital, leaving behind his wife Mary; his three children, Bobof Montreal, Stewart (Ida) of Alberta; and Gerri (Armand) of Rockland, Ont., also seven grandchildren, many nieces and nephews and his brother Burry.
