Hit-and-run driver faces four counts

The Sûreté du Ste-Martine investigation into the fatal hit-and-run accident April 9 continues, with the suspect, Gérard Dagenais, 64, of 2352 Rte. 201 in St-Malachie, released with conditions last Thursday from Valleyfield jail.

Dagenais appeared in court to answer four charges related to the incident: impaired-driving causing a death, impaired driving causing an injury, driving with a alcohol blood count of over 80 milligrams, and hit-and-run. A preliminary hearing date set for tomorrow (Thursday) will likely be postponed, police said.

Suzie Dallaire, 32, of the Rivière Noire Rd. in St-Jean-Christophe was killed in the accident, while her passenger, Georgette Charette, 70, the suspect's wife, was seriously injured and remains in a Montreal hospital.

A police spokesman said the investigation is continuing.

Fireman, 52, dies while working at St-Louis fire hall

About 80 firemen from departments around the Valley attended the Monday afternoon funeral of St-Louis-de-Gonzague fireman Réal Boulet, 52, who died Friday evening while working on vehicles at the local fire hall.

Boulet was found by another fireman around 11 p.m. where he had fallen between two trucks. He had been working on the motor of one since about 9 p.m., and a Valleyfield Sûreté du Québec spokesman said that three trucks were running in the fire station at the time, "so there were lots of fumes in the building".

District coroner Dr. Gordon Thompson was asked to perform an autopsy to ascertain whether Boulet was the victim of a heart attack, asphyxiation from the fumes, or another cause. As of Gleaner press time, police had not yet received the autopsy report.

The St-Louis parish church was packed for the funeral. Boulet had been a volunteer fireman for 23 years. (J.T.)

He also gave freely of his time helping with the fund-raising drive by the local Heart Association and other organizations. He so much wanted to show his appreciation for having gained a new lease on life because of the transplant.

He will be very much missed by his family and many friends.

Deepest sympathy is extended to his dear mother, Jean; his children, Melanie and Daniel; also his brothers: Ronald, Dennis and Robert (Janice); and his sisters Lynda (Sam Schallie); Marion (Gil Charbonneau); and his nieces and nephews.
