Huntingdon native R. Daniel dies in B.C.

Huntingdon native Reginald Walter Daniel died May 26, 1994, in Kelowna, B.C. He was the beloved husband of Ruth, of Peachland, B.C., and father of Wendy Daniel and Margaret Blank (Howard), both of Calgary. He also leaves his grandchildren, Gina and Marty Blank of Calgary, and several nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by his son, Philip, in 1981; by his brothers, Ivor and Harold; and by his mother, Amy Bunce Daniel.

Born in Huntingdon on September 6, 1914, Reg attended Huntingdon Academy. He served honorably in the Black Watch during World War I, and was wounded in action in France.

He was active after the War in Branch 81 of the Royal Canadian Legion, and in the Chateauguay Lodge of the Masons,

who named him a Life Member earlier this year.

He worked for 35 years as an officer of the Department of Immigration, serving on border posts at Trout River, Dundee, Montreal and Quebec City.

In 1972 he retired, and in 1978 he and Ruth moved to Peachland, B.C., where they continued to enjoy travel, gardening and community service.

He will be missed, not only by his family, but also by those who knew him for his quiet generosity and his basic decency and fairness.
