

Former Ormstown doctor honored

Old-time Ormstown area residents will be glad to hear of memorial honors being accorded in the Sherbrooke area to the late Dr. T. J. Quintin, who practised in Ormstown between 1932 and 1946.

At a dedication ceremony at the Sherbrooke Hospital in mid-October, it was announced that two plaques (one in the hospital lobby and one in the Dr. T.J. Quintin Memorial Library) as well as an annual memorial lecture will be dedicated to Dr. Quintin, who died in March 1993 at the age of 90. The city of Sherbrooke has also been asked to name a street in his memory.

Dr. Quintin came to Ormstown in 1932 to join Dr. Murray Stalker, who had begun to practise there in 1926. Together they established the first Ormstown Medical Centre on Lambton St., where the Post Office is now located.

In 1939, Drs. Stalker and Quintin were members of a provisional board of directors for the first Barrie Memorial Hospital, located on Church St. (The building now houses La Residence Ormstown, a seniors' home.)

Dr. Quintin was involved in planning for the present hospital in Ormstown, but in 1946 he and his family moved to Sherbrooke where he served that community faithfully for many years.
