Multi-talented E. Cooper will be missed in V'field

The Valleyfield community was greatly saddened by the unexpected death of Evan Cooper, at the Valleyfield Hospital on Monday, Nov. 21 1994, at the age of 79.

The Memorial Service was held at 2 p.m. Friday, Nov. 25, at the Valleyfield Presbyterian Church, with many old friends paying their last respects alongside family members.

His remains were laid to rest in the Valleyfield Protestant Cemetery beside his beloved wife, the former Jean Mary Gagnon, who predeceased him some years ago.

Evan was born in Aberdeen, Scotland, on April 11, 1915, and arrived in Valleyfield at the age of 13, along with his parents and siblings: Eddie, Stanley, Frank, Jimmy and Jean (Calhoun), most of whom have predeceased him.

He attended the Gault Institute, and afterwards worked at the old Montreal Cottons, until the outbreak of W.W. II.

In 1940 he joined the Canadian Black Watch Regiment as a wireless operator. Subsequently he was promoted to Lance-Corporal, serving overseas in England, France, Holland, and Germany and returning

home at the end of the War in 1945. A very talented person, on his return to Canada, Evan took courses in design and screen-printing of fabrics, and returned to Dominion Textiles in this capacity. He retired at the age of 65.

He was also a commercial artist, painting many signs in the Valleyfield area, some of which are still in use today. A very talented musician, he gave lessons in piano, organ and piano accordion at a music store in Valleyfield, and was also a member of various bands in the area over the years.

Sadly, he suffered from ill-health over the past few years.

Deepest sympathy is extended to his bereaved family: daughter Beverly (Turner) and her two children, Cheryl and Joanne of Cambridge, Ont.; son Steven and companion Diana of Valleyfield; daughter Michelle (Raymond Hoff), and their four children, also of Cambridge, Ont.; and youngest daughter, Sonya, (Raymond Brown), and their two children, Jessica and baby son, Evan, of Valleyfield.

Evan will be sadly missed in this community.
