

Former Dundee mayor L.D. Fraser dead at 80

Life-long Dundee resident, Lester David Fraser passed away at the Huntingdon County Hospital Center on November 2, 1994 after an illness of several months.

Born July 17, 1914, he was the eldest son of the late John James Fraser and his wife, the late Cora Lavers Fraser.

He lived and worked on the family farm and in 1944 was united in marriage to Marguerite Mary Burbank of Sherbrooke, Que., who predeceased him in August 1983.

Lester Fraser served his community on the Dundee council for several years and was mayor in 1957-58 and again in 1961-62. He was an active member of Zion United Church and served on the Board of Trustees.
