Lillian B. Chisholm leaves happy memories in Howick

Whatever the name used (Lillian, Miss Brown, Lill, Mrs. Chisholm, Mom, Aunt Lill, or Grannie) it depicted a lively lady with a delightful infectious grin. We lost her on January 15, 1995, when God took her home, as she never doubted for her faith

was strong.

Lillian's life began April 16, 1905, on rather a tentative note: a baby so tiny she received no middle name, and was carried on a cushion for protection according to her own story-telling. She was the third daughter born to Margaret Gardner and John Brown, and sister to Viola and Winnifred. A baby brother, Melville, joined them later to complete the family living at Elmbank Farm on the Chateauguay River near Howick.

Childhood was a jumble of playing with siblings, neighbors, and cousins; chores, some mischief, and studies at District #4 Schoolhouse just across the line fence. There were days of sadness, for Mother died in 1913 leaving a bewildered young family. Various relatives tried to fall the empty space until sister Viola took over the homemaker role.

Lillian found her wings as a schoolteacher after taking training at Macdonald College. She taught in Dundee, Powerscourt and Ormstown Concession Schools. Her students were among those who came to pay their respects and share their memories.

Lillian met Bruce Chisholm at a dance and they became lifelong partners in June The couple spent their working years on the family farm on Tullochgorum Road. And yes, dancing was occasion for special outings. The arrival of a daughter, Anita, was celebrated. A generation later three grandchildren were greeted with joy.

Following Bruce's death in 1973, Lillian moved to Howick Village where she was active in home, garden, and community affairs. She was a charter member of Howick United Church and a staunch supporte: of WMS (Women's Missionary Society). When that organization changed to UCW (United Church Women), she was an advocate for the transformation. W.I. (Women's Institute) claimed Lillian's interest and talents over the years. Her Life Membership pins were possessions of pride.

Lillian will be remembered for her good humor and warmth, as well as her lively interest in the world around her. She entered into all she did wholeheartedly, whether it was an animated discussion, or her creative quilting and needlework.

She could be counted on the record and retell history for days gone by, and to produce small artifacts from her collection as illustrations; like the wonderful Memory Books she made for her grandchildren. Above all, she was fun to be with - a view confirmed by representatives of four generations.

Predeceased by sister Viola Kerr, Lillian leaves to honor her memory: sister Win-nifred Ferguson in Florida; brother Melville Brown with his wife Susan and sons Robert, Mark, and Jimmy, all of Chateauguay; granddaughters Jelia in Toronto, and Angela in Vancouver; as well as nieces and nephews in three gen-

erations. Lillian's funeral service was conducted by Rev. Beverley Burlock on January 18, 1995, at McGerrigle's Funeral Home in Ormstown. Interment fellowed at the Union Cemetery. Pallbearers were Ross Brown, Steve Lalonde, Gordon Lang, and Jim McCartney.
