V'field funeral service held for Adam Scherf

There is a sequel to the story on the death of Adam Scherf, which occurred at his home in Campbell River, B.C., on April 20.

On Monday, May 1, a poignant funeral service was held at Notre Dame Church, in Bellerive, Valleyfield.

Adam's beloved wife Betty, accompanied by their daughter, Catherine, of Quadra Island, Vancouver, had brought Adam's ashes for interment in the Valleyfield Catholic Cemetery.

They arrived with sons Jim, his wife Kathleen; and Mike, accompanied by his wife Brenda and their three small daughters, Marina, Nancy and Elizabeth.

The Mass was held at 11 a.m. with an old family friend and former Pastor of the St. Ignatius School, Fr. Denis Laberge, officiating. He also gave the very touching eulogy.

Thanks to the note in The Gleaner, there was a wonderful attendance of many friends from the Huntingdon, Ormstown and Valleyfield areas.

Adam was born in Valleyfield in 1908, and attended school here.

Up until his retirement in 1973, he was a respected employee of the Bell Telephone Co., in this area.

On April 22, 1944, he married Elizabeth Atkins, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Jim Atkins, also of Valleyfield.

The couple were blessed with five children: James, Catherine, Michael, Margaret and Steven.

Following Adam's retirement, and because of his health problems, Adam and Betty decided to move to what they hoped was a better climate in Victoria, B.C., where they lived for only a short time before moving to Campbell River.

In this beautiful area of B.C., Adam could really enjoy his one main pleasure of fishing, which he had enjoyed since childhood, but here it was the big salmon he would catch and proudly show off to his family!
