Dr. Parham was predeceased by his parents, Wilfrid Laurier Parham and Gladys Margery Parham, and by Howard and Jean Farley, the loving uncle and aunt who raised him from an age

Huntingdon. Dr. Parham was born in Fiji in 1941 and raised in the Montreal area. went to North Bay in 1970 where for awhile he was the whole Psychology Department of the flegling Nipissing University. (He held a BA degree from Sir Williams University, and an MA and PhD from the University of Toronto.) An inspiring teacher, he soon established himself as a cultural force in the larger community.

Of all the arts, perhaps his greatest love was music. He was founding member of North Society, Symphony and even wrote and presented a 'joy of music' program series for CBC Radio.

There are things his friends, colleagues and students will especially remember about Lin: his irrepressible, wry, irreverent wit; and his passionate, bone-deep, reverent love of beauty. There are two debts that those who knew him will never be able to repay; his ability to inspire a love of the arts and science; and his unhesitant, unquestioning generosity.
