

# Former Havelock mayor Kenneth Sample, 84, dies

Kenneth Mark Sample, aged 84, died suddenly in hospital on July 23, 1995.

He was the beloved husband of the late Isabel Mary McKee and the dear father of two sons; Norris and Winston.

Kenneth was born January 2, 1911 and christened on March 14, on the occasion of his grandparents' (Mr. and Mrs. Alexander Milne), Golden Wedding anniversary.

After completing high school Kenneth attended Macdonald College between 1927-29, working away from home until 1935 when he returned to the farm of his father and Uncle Ernest. His father had worked the farm for 62 years and Kenneth farmed the land for the next 60 years. He planted apple trees and began a modern sugaring operation.

On July 4, 1936, he married Isabel McKee, a teacher, and they later had two sons: Norris Earle and Kenneth Winston. Both sons became involved in landscaping and farming.

In 1959 the farm was registered as MacAngus Farm when Kenneth set up a purebred Aberdeen Angus herd. He was joined by his son, Norris and wife Lynn in 1963. In 1986 the farm came under the man-

agement of grandson David and his wife Kelly.

Kenneth was active in the community and in his church, serving as an Elder of the Wesley Knox Church, and its Treasurer and lending his voice to the choir.

He joined the Havelock Fair Board in 1953 and served as vice-president from 1965-70. He was then elected president and held this position between 1970-1982.

He joined Havelock Council in 1960 and was elected Mayor in 1967, holding this position until 1977. Kenneth was also a

Life Member of the Quebec Aberdeen Angus Association.

Following the funeral service on July 26 at Wesley Knox United Church, he was laid to rest in the Covey Hill Union Cemetery.

He leaves to mourn his passing his sons Norris and Winston; his grandchildren: Kimberly, Debbie, David, Douglas and Kelly, and his great-grandchildren: Alexander, Colton and Miranda Lynne.

Kenneth's presence within the community will be greatly missed by his family and friends.

As well as being busy on the farm, both Thelma and Clifford were school-bus drivers for more than 25 years. They retired to Howick in 1980, visiting other parts of Canada where their children had moved.

During the 1950s she participated in little plays at the Legion Hall, where which she would also sing some of Gracie's old songs.
