## SQ investigates suspect death of local man, 59

The death of Patrick Richer, 59, of Huntingdon is still being investigated by the Montreal-based Sûreté du Québec Crimes against the person squad as a suspicious death.

A preliminary autopsy on Richer's body, which was discovered in the lobby of his apartment at 31 Bouchette St. around 5:30 a.m. on Friday, Aug. 25, shows that his skull had been fractured. Police are still waiting for the results of a toxicologist's report to determine if drugs or alcohol were factors in the death.

A police spokesman said that they are aware that Richer had been involved in an altercation the night before. They hope that a further autopsy will determine if the victim fell accidentally or had experienced a blow to the head.

The body was found with some blood coming out of one ear. Richer had last been seen alive around 10 p.m. on Thursday, Aug. 24.
