

Mrs. Clifford Moore, 84, dies in Richmond, Que.

Alison (Ewing) Moore, for 35 years a resident of Ormstown, died August 15, 1995 in Richmond, Que. at the age of 84.

She was born November 30, 1910 in Richmond, daughter of William John Ewing and Adele Atkinson. Her father was clerk of the circuit court in Richmond, registrar of Richmond County and Justice of the Peace. A community-minded person, she was instrumental in the early development of the Wales Home.

Alison received her elementary and high-school education at St. Francis College High School in Richmond, going on to Bishop's University where she received her Bachelor of Arts degree and high-school teaching certificate in 1932.

Her first teaching assignments were in Valleyfield and Waterloo High Schools, and Commissioners' High School in Quebec City.

On August 19, 1939, she married Clifford Moore, at that time principal of Knowlton High School.

After two or three moves during a span of 20 years, the Moores

finally moved to Ormstown in 1958. Alison fell in love with the town and hoped this was their last move. With the purchase of a home on Lambton St., her dream was realized.

In 1967, she taught Latin briefly, in the Regional High School (C.V.R.). But after three years, the school board decided to phase out Latin, and for the second time in her life, Alison retired from teaching.

In later life, Alison's major achievement was as president of the Barrie Memorial Hospital Women's Auxiliary. That year's Bazaar was a huge success, and when her term was finished, she was asked to sit as a director on the Board of Governors of the Hospital.

After she celebrated her 50th wedding anniversary with her husband in 1989, Alison's health began to deteriorate. As a result, in October 1993, they moved into the Wales Home in Richmond, Que. Despite the fact that Alison had good nursing and medical care, there were so many

things going awry that it was too much for her, and on August 15, 1995 she passed away.

A Memorial Service was held in St. Anne's Anglican Church, Richmond, Friday, Aug. 18, Rev. Ken Harding officiating, assisted by the Rev. Ruth Matthews. Family friend Dr. John Whitehead of Ormstown paid eloquent tribute to Alison. Graveside prayers and a committal service were held on Saturday morning, Aug. 19, at Maple Grove Cemetery in Melbourne.

Alison will be sorely missed by her husband Clifford, her daughter Diana, her son John and his wife Elaine, her loving grandsons, Sean Justin and David James, as well as her sister Muriel Gillin and special nieces, Patty, Jodie and Allison Charters. She is also survived by her brother-in-law Archie Moore, his wife Betty, and their children who were also special to her, as well as many nephews and nieces in Ontario and Quebec.
