EVERYONE WELCOME

A 43 year-old man is dead following a Sunday morning fire which razed a converted school bus deep in the bush behind a rural Hemmingford property.

Hemmingford firemen and ambulance personnel had to struggle along a makeshift road cut through the bush just before 2 a.m. to the back of the farm at 1041 Whyte Rd., to reach the fire in a wooden structure attached to a converted school bus.

Jean-Guy Boulanger, his wife and two daughters were asleep when the blaze broke out in the extension of the bus. Boulanger stayed to fight the blaze while the three others went to seek help. Trapped inside the burning structure, the man died before firemen could come to the rescue.

Hemmingford fire chief Jim Paul said the Montreal-based investigation squad of the Sureté du Québec was called in, as is the case in all fatal fires.

The dwelling was located on the

property of Gilbert Pothier.

By the time the blaze was brought under control about 2:30 a.m., all that was left was "the shell of the bus", Paul said.

"It was a very remote location, and the difficulty of getting our equipment in to the site hindered our response," he said.

While the Hemmingford brigade was out on the call, the Mooers N.Y. fire department was on stand-by at the Hemmingford fire station.
