Longtime Covey Hill resident dies at 71, in Malone N.Y.

Martha Weiskopf Meyer died peacefully in Malone N.Y. on Monday Nov. 13. She was 71.

Born in the city of Podersam, in the former Czechoslovakia, on March 23, 1924, an adventurous Martha came to Canada after World War II, with the intention of spending a year in this "great land of Indians, Eskimos and snow", before returning to Germany.

Life surprised her with love when she met André Meyer, himself from Pano, in Montreal. In 1957, they chose to raise their family in the fresh air of Covey Hill, and embarked on the adventures and chal-

lenges which go hand-in-hand with novice farmers in an unfamiliar environment. Martha's entrepreneurial spirit led her into many interesting fields; she was a worldly person, interested in all aspects of life, and she lived it to the fullest.

After a short illness, she died peacefully in Malone. She was predeceased by her husband André Charles Meyer in 1978, and by her brother Rudolf Weiskopf of Grossen Busseck, Germany.
