### Rosabelle Jones, 73, dies in Huntingdon

Rosabelle Jones, 73, wife of Kelsey Jones of Cook's Lines died peacefully in the Huntingdon Chronic Hospital on Saturday, Dec. 2, following a severe stroke.

Mrs. Jones was paralyzed in a car accident over 20 years ago, but lived with her husband until about three years ago, when she had to enter hospital. Despite her paralysis, the couple had travelled widely in their motor home as long as he was able to

take care of her. She had been a concert pianist and had performed with her husband, also a pianist, on stage and on CBC broadcasts. They met in 1940 at Mount Allison University where both earned Bachelor of Music degrees. They were married in 1942 and she accompanied him to Paris where he studied under Nadia Boulanger.
