

Covey Hill's Reta Curran mourned by family, friends

Covey Hill's most senior resident, Reta Alexandria Gilmore, beloved wife of the late H. Keith Curran (1991), died peacefully in her 90th year, on Monday, Jan. 22, 1996 at the Barrie Memorial Hospital in Ormstown. She was predeceased by her parents, William and Margaret (Fiddes) Gilmore; her sister Hazel (Peter Peddie); and her son Harold (1953), and is survived by her loving daughter Dorothy (John W. Clarke); three cherished granddaughters (Cheryl of Oakville, Ont., Connie of Mississauga, Ont. and Crystal of Calgary, Alta.) and nephews Ross Peddie and Thomas and Donald Curran as well as several cousins and a host of friends.

Reta was a lady who always gave to others. She keenly supported her family on their farm and gave generously to those that she cared for in their golden years.

Always a participant, Reta was an avid visitor, always interested in what was going on in her community of Covey Hill, as well as in municipi-

pal, provincial and federal concerns.

During her lifetime, Reta was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star (Victory Chapter #34), and a devoted worker in her church Ladies' Aid. She always lovingly supported her childhood church, "The Little White Church" at Russeltown Flatts.

In 1882, Reta left the family farm after almost 60 years, to take up residence at the Vilouary Residence in Hemmingford where she continued to enjoy the many people she came in contact with.

A celebration of Reta's life was held on Saturday, Feb. 10, at Wesley Knox United Church, with the Rev. Donald Stirling officiating and remembrances from Charles Clarke.

Her three granddaughters carried her remains to her final resting place beside her late husband Keith and son Harold at the Wesley United Church Cemetery. Donations to the Wesley United Church Cemetery Fund would be Reta's preference as a memorial.

Athelstan man killed in car crash

A young Athelstan man lost his life in a car accident Saturday night around midnight on Tully's Ridge Rd. in Hinchinbrooke.

Killed in the single-car accident was driver Philippe Renaud, 22, who was alone in the car when he lost control of his vehicle and smashed into a tree near a curve in the road.

According to police who attempted to intercept the motorist, Renaud was travelling at an excessive speed several minutes before the crash.

The Jaws of Life rescue equipment were used by volunteer firemen to remove the body from the car.

Coroner Gordon Thompson said that Renaud was likely killed on impact.
