Lillian Amos, 64, dies suddenly in Valleyfield

The Valleyfield community has been saddened by the sudden death of Lillian Amos, (née Shaw), on May 2, 1996, at the age of 64.

The funeral service was held Saturday, May 7 at St. Mark's Anglican Church, Valleyfield, with Fr. Ed. Majka officiating.

The church was filled with family members and friends who had come to offer condolences and say good-bye.

Lillian was born in Port Lewis on June 22, 1931, daughter of the late Janet Cluff and William Shaw.

The family moved to Valleyfield in 1939, where she attended the Gault Institute along with her siblings.

She then worked for Dominion Textiles for many years.

In January, 1962, she married the late Walter Amos, an

employee off the Grace Davidson Chemical plant. Because of the fire which destroyed St. Mark's Anglican Church in December 1961, they were married in the Beauharnois Anglican Church, eventually taking up residence in Nitro.

The couple were blessed with one son, Michael, born in 1970.

Lillian was predeceased by her beloved husband, Walter, in July 1994.
