Former resident of Huntingdon dies in England at age of 95

Mrs. Emily Pace, of Old Lodge Nursing Home, Chard, England died on May 1, aged 95.

Born in Montreal, after leaving school she assisted her father in his jewellery shop. She went on to become the first lady member of the Canadian Jewellers' Institute Watchmakers' Division.

Later she managed the shop alone until her marriage to Charlie when he joined the business.

She was an avid member of the Ladies Guild in Huntingdon and sang in her local church choir for many years.

After their retirement to England in 1960, she continued to repair clocks and watches for her
