## William Wallace, 91, mourned in Valleyfield

The Valleyfield community was saddened by the death of William (Bill) Wallace, on Monday, June 10, 1996 at the age of 91.

A memorial service was held at Larin's Funeral Salon, on Danis St., on Wednesday, June 12, with Rev. B. Grace officiating, and many friends and family members in attendance.

On June 15, his remains were transported to Tweed, Ontario, for interment beside his beloved wife, Cecilia, who predeceased him just four years ago. Bill's youngest brother, Rev. Robert Wallace, officiated at the burial service.

Bill was born on October 4, 1904, in Bury St. Edmunds, England, the son of the late James Frederick Wallace and Eva Price.

The family came to Canada in 1908, when Bill was only four, and lived in the Toronto area for a short time before moving to Sulphide, Ont.

Bill was the eldest of 12 children. After finishing schools he became an employee of Nichols Sulphide (later Allied Chemicals). In 1928, in Delora, Ont., he married Cecilia Almira Lloyd, daughter of the late Benjamin Lloyd and Elizabeth bathes of Marmora, Ont.

They were blessed with four children; Irene, William, Vernon and John.

In 1941 the family moved to Valleyfield when Bill was transferred to the newlybuild Nichols Chemical Plant.

Bill, a hard worker and dedicated family man, was much respected. Both he and his wife, Cecilia (Cees), made many friends over the years, and he will be sadly missed.


