Cell-mate held for murder of Ormstown man in V'field jail

A 39 year-old Ormstown man was beaten to death in Valleyfield 's provincial jail during the night of July 26, presumably by his cell-

Dead is René Emond, who was serving a one-year term impaired driving. He was sharing a cell with Valleyfield native Alexandre Legault, 20, sentenced to 77 days in jail for a July 3 attack on a woman in a Valleyfield bar.

Emond's mutilated body was discovered by prison staff around 4 a.m. July 27.


Legault appeared in court in Valleyfield on Monday July 29 and was transferred to Montreal's Pinel Institute for psychiatric tests. Police said Legault claimed he was being chased by demons who were trying

Members of Emond's family (he has 18 brothers and sisters) and others questioned how the violent events (Emond's body was eviscerated and partially dismembered) could have occurred without being noticed by jail guards. The family also wants to know why Emond was placed in the same cell as a violent offender like Legault.


Arthur Fauteux, regional director of correctional services, stated that Legault's behavior in jail up to that point had given no signs of violence.

"He had shown no signs of aggression during his imprisonment, up until the time of the murder," he said.
