Two men die in V'field explosion

Two employees of a toxic waste-handling company died August 26 in an explosion at the CEZinc plant in Valleyfield.

Quincy Paquette, 23, and Alain Bernard, 42, both of the Beauce region, died from breathing sulphuric acid fumes after the rear hatch of their tanker truck blew off in their faces.

One man died on the spot and the other was taken to the emergency department at Valleyfield's Suroit Regional Hospital where he died a few minutes later, according to Agt. Réjean Lavigne of the SQ's des Riverains office.

Lavigne said the accident occurred during a what was normally a routine operation. The Sanivan workers were making a regular visit to empty the sulphuric acid tanks at the plant. The acid is a by-product of the zinc processing operation.

"For unknown reasons, a chemical reaction inside the truck blew two hatches, one at the exact location where the two men were working," the police officer said.
