Elgin man dies following January 10 crash

An 84-year-old Elgin man has died in the Barrie Memorial Hospital in Ormstown following injuries sustained in a two-vehicle crash on Godmanchester's Rte. 138 near First Concession on January 10.

The victim, James Park, and his wife Eveline, who received minor injuries in the 9:50 a.m. accident, were in a car which collided with a pickup truck.

A Haut-St-Laurent Sûreté du Québec spokesman said one driver did not yield the right of way to the other at an intersection, causing the accident.

The driver of the truck was uninjured, police added.
