R.N. Betty Gibbs loved babies, headed Barrie maternity unit

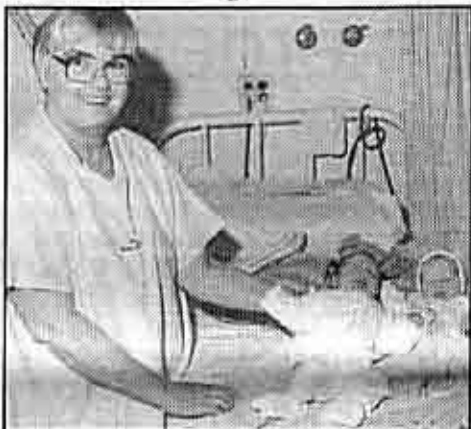
Betty Gibbs passed away January 26, 1999, at the Barrie Memorial Hospital after a lengthy illness.
