Beryl Millett, 81, was pillar of literacy movement here

Beryl Millett, who died April 8 in Chateaugay at the age of 81, will be remembered all over the Chateaugay Valley for her decade of tireless work on behalf of the Chateaugay Valley Literacy Council.

Her efforts were instrumental in setting up a one-on-one tutoring system, with over 20 volunteer tutors working out of Chateaugay, Léry, Howick, Huntingdon, Hemmingford, Ormstown, Franklin Centre and St-Chrysostome.

Before she retired from this work at the age of 80, she suggested a centre be set up to house the Council's activities. Up to that time, most tutoring went on the homes of the tutors or their students.

As a result, there is now a Resource Centre at the H.S. Billings Career Educa-

tion Centre and a small office in the Chateaugay Valley Career Education Centre on Ormstown. All together, over 50 tutors now work with an equal number of students from Kahnawake through the Valley all the way to Dundee on the US border.

In her memory, the Beryl Millett Memorial Student Fund will be established, welcoming donations from those wishing to honor her memory. The Fund will help students to attend conferences and workshops on literacy.

Funeral services were held April 12 at St. Andrew's United Church, Chateaugay. Wife of the late Leslie Millett, she is survived by two children, their families and many other relatives and friends.

Local man killed in car crash

A single-car accident on Rte. 138 west of Dewittville around 5 a.m. on April 25 has claimed the life of Donald Deschambault, 24, of Huntingdon.

A Sûreté du Québec spokesman said the victim's car veered gradually off the road and onto the shoulder before hitting a cement culvert in a ditch. Deschambault was thrown from his car, which flipped over and trapped him beneath.

Ambulance technicians needed the Ormstown fire department's Jaws of Life to free the victim.

Police said it is possible the driver had fallen asleep at the wheel.
