

The high regard in which he was held was shared by many friends, relatives and neighbors during the visitation and at his funeral, from St. Paul's Church, Herdman.

Ivan was Norma Gray's beloved husband

for 48 years, proud father of sons Donald and Lee, and their spouses, Goldic and Pam, and cherished grandfather to Bobbi-Jo, Stevan, Tanner and Mason, all of Alberta. He was the son of Hearn and Winnifred Graham, brother of Jean Campbell, and Ayliffe Kettles, and close friend to their husbands, the late Kenneth Campbell and Nicol Kettles.
