

Two dead in Januarv 5 blaze in Valleyfield rooming house

An investigation has been launched into the cause of a rooming-house fire which took two lives in Valleyfield last week.

A century-old building at 54 St-Laurent St. was destroyed by flames during the early morning hours of Wednesday Jan. 5. The structure housed a main-floor restaurant, Chez Jacques, and 20 rooms for rent on the top two stories.

Two elderly brothers, Lucien and Réal Benoît, aged 87 and 83 respectively, were burned to death in their third-floor room.

The rest of the tenants escaped, either on their own or with the aid of firemen from the Riverains, emergency service aided by the Melocheville and St-Timothée detachments. Four were treated at the Suroit Regional Hospital for smoke inhalation, and a couple more could not be found at first, but were later located, one at the home of a sister in Ormstown.

Spread rapidly

High winds fanned the blaze, which spread rapidly after it broke out on the second floor of the building shortly before 1 a.m. Wednesday. Firemen worked hard to prevent it spreading to adjacent structures, but a neighboring duplex and an ice-cream stand were also damaged. The fire was brought under control about 7

a.m. Damages were estimated at \$500,000. Owners Jacques and Michèle Rivest, who ran the restaurant for the past 30 years with their 11 employees, have not yet decided whether they will rebuild.

Most of the building's tenants escaped with only the clothes on their backs and were housed temporarily at a nearby motel. Most carried no insurance.

The Riverains regional police force is in charge of the investigation.
