### Obituary

## Kenneth J. Sears, aged 78, died February 11 in Malone

Kenneth J. Sears of West Bangor NY, a dairy farmer with many friends in the Huntingdon area, died February 11 in Malone, He was 78.

Born November 21, 1921 in Ellenburg Center NY, he worked in Massena and Lyon Mountain before joining the US Army to serve in Europe in World War II. He received several service medals before being discharged from the army in 1946. He returned to Bangor, where he operated a dairy farm with his father. After the latter's retirement in 1970, he continued to run the farm on his own.

#### Active in community

A communicant of St. Augustine's Church, North Bangor, and St. Edward's Church in West Bangor, he also belonged to the American Legion Post in Lyon Mountain, the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Ellenburg and was a past member of Bangor Grange and the Businessmen Full Gospel International when it had a chapter in Malone.

He is survived by two sisters and a brother-in-law, Elva K. Sears of North Bangor and Joyce and Leonard Crate of Bangor; and three nieces and four nephews and their families. He was predeceased by his parents, Ernest and Delmina La Count Sears, a brother Gerald and an infant sister Geraldine.

The funeral Mass was held Tuesday Feb. 15 in North Bangor. Pallbearers were Maurice Forkey and Harold French, and the American Legion held a prayer service at the wake. He will be buried with full military honors in the spring in St. Patrick's Cemetery, Chateaugay NY.
