Late Earle Young Templeton had distinguished career in education Home and family life were always Of Earle Young Templeton it could be

said that his courageous cheerfulness during the last years of his life as he battled health problems was inspiring to everyone who came in contact with him. When asked, "How are you?" his answer was always, "I'm fine". Earle was born June 11, 1921, in the neestral Templeton home on ancestral

Riverfield's Scotch Concession. He was the fourth son of Wallace Templeton and Marjory Thompson in a family of seven (James, Douglas, Donald, Betty, Murray and Jean) and was baptised by Rev. Ballantyne in Riverfield Presbyterian Church. After attending Riverfield's one-room school, Earle went on to Howick High

and then Bishop's University where he received a BSc in 1942. After working for a year at the Cherrier plant of the Inspection Board of the United Kingdom of Canada, he began

his teaching career at Granby High School. Four years later he returned to Bishop's for Education courses and taught at Lennoxville High School. The next year, he moyed to St-<Lambert where he spent 18 years as teacher, viceprincipal, principal and supervisor of education. First CVR principal

His career in education then brought him to Ormstown in1967 as the first principal of Chateauguay Valley Regional High School. He returned to teaching at the end of his career, retiring in June

1978 after 35 years. Earle received the Second Degree Award for great Merit in 1970, in recognition of "his broad experience, integrity, modesty and unfailing
