Obituary

Late E. R. Claesson, 85, grew up in Athelstan area

Edgar Richard Claesson of Needham, Mass., died September 12, 2000.

Born in Bethune, Sask., on July 28, 1915, he was the son of the late George and Laura Claesson. He grew up in Athelstan and was the oldest of 13 children, 11 of whom are still living. He joined the Canadian Army in 1942 and was discharged four years later.

He married Deborah Potter of Needham, Mass., where they lived for 37 years. He

retired only at the age of 82 from the Wellesley Public Works Department.

He is survived by his wife Deborah, step-son James Ferrier, two step-grandchildren, Paddy and Bobby Ferrier; his brothers and sisters and several nieces and nephews.
