**JACKSON, Miss Mabel Edith** - Peacefully at age 103 at Caressant Care, Woodstock, ON on Monday, July 3, 2000. Born in East Angus, QC, daughter of the late Geo. W. Jackson (1871-1938) and his wife, Mary A. Sundberg (1880-1977), of Birchton, QC, sister of the late Pearl O. Goodman (1900-1997), Niagara Falls, ON, Percy K. Jackson (1903-1988), Cookshire, QC, Lola J. Brown (1905-1968), Barrie, ON, Phoebe I. Harrison (1908-1988), Peterborough, ON, and Arnold M. Jackson (1913-1973), Woodstock, ON. At age 4 she was bitten by a dog - "the poor little girl's face was frightfully torn" - but, due to the expert care and devotion of her mother, she survived. She graduated from Gleason's Shorthand and Business College, Sherbrooke, QC (1920) and was a typist at Ingersoll-Rand. In 1924 she went to New York City as a stenographer for a notary at \$29 per month. She returned to the family farm (Birchton - Eaton Corner) in 1937 when her father was sick. In 1945 she moved with her mother to 83 Finkle St., Woodstock, ON where Arnold Jackson was a jeweller at Gibson's. Later, in 1956 they moved to 123 Wellington St. N. During the late 1950's she began to work at the Coop. "Mabel's a good worker, but don't tell her that!" In 1993 she became a resident of Caressant Care where she was soon joined by her sister, Pearl Goodman. On her 100th birthday she received greetings from Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. She was the beloved aunt of Theda M. Lowry, Sawyerville, QC.; Merrill A. Jackson, Northfield, N.H.; Carl P. Jackson, Franklin Centre, QC; Joan Jackson and Ronald Jackson, Woodstock, ON; Marion Vernon, Scarborough, ON; and Norman Brown, Whitby, ON. Miss Jackson will be remembered for her hard work, persistence, consistent habits and frugality - the end of an era. She was buried in the Eaton Cemetery, Birchton, QC, opposite the family farm.

**GOODMAN, Pearl Oriana** - Peacefully at age 97 at Caressant Care, Woodstock, ON July 7, 1997. Born in East Angus, QC on March 14, 1900, daughter of the late George W. Jackson and his wife, Mary A. Sundberg, of Birchton, QC, sister of the recently-deceased Mabel E. Jackson. She came to Niagara Falls, ON in 1919 and was married to Thomas Henry Goodman on Dec. 24, 1927. Her husband predeceased her on Feb. 17, 1955; both were predeceased by a daughter, Mary Roseanna, (age 28 da). Being one of the oldest and longest-time residents of Niagara Falls, she was greeted by Lt.-Gov. Lincoln Alexander at the Festival of Lights on Nov. 25, 1985. Pearl Goodman was known for her sense of humour, and for her love of riding the trains! She was buried beside her husband in Fairview Cemetery, in Niagara Falls which she loved so well.
