Three dead in head-on crash

Three people died in a head-on collision in St-Anicet on the afternoon of Wednesday Feb. 14.

Dead are 71-year old Emile Lepage, Christiane Boyer, 36, both of St-Anicet, and 40 year-old Michel Beauchamp of Valleyfield. All three were in a Cutlass Sierra which collided with a Ford Ranger pick-up truck on Route 132 about 3:15 p.m. during a heavy snowstorm.

Two people in the pick-up were also hurt, but their injuries were not life-threatening.

The car driven by Lepage went out of control on a curve and swerved into the oncoming lane, police said. The car was a total loss and the truck received damages to the front end. Road conditions were slippery at the time of the accident due to the heavy snowfall.



The three victims were declared dead on arrival at the Suroît Regional Hospital in Valleyfield, where the occupants of the other vehicle were treated.

Police are continuing their investigation of the circumstances of the accident.
