St-Chrysostome's A. McKenzie dies

Angus McKenzie, mayor of St-Chrysostome Village from 1993 until municipal fusion in the year 2000, died Thursday May 3 in Ormstown's Barrie Memorial Hospital. He was 57.

Despite his Scottish name, McKenzie was a francophone who, as well as working as a plumber, took a keen interest in municipal affairs. During his terms as

mayor, the process began which led to the February 2000 fusion of St-Chrysostome Village and the Parish of St-Jean-Chrysostome (at that time headed by mayor Denis R. Vincent). After fusion became a reality, both mayors ran against, and were defeated by, former provincial Liberal organizer Gilles Bigras, currently the mayor of the new municipality.

Huntingdon native, wife killed in crash on Rte. 20

A Huntingdon native now living in Cornwall Ont., and his wife were killed in a weekend accident which claimed four lives on Highway 20 near Coteau-du-Lac.

Brent Pringle, 41, and his wife Natalie Tesch Pringle, 37, were on their way home to Cornwall from Huntingdon just before midnight Saturday, after attending a birthday party for his father Osborne.

An eastbound car went out of control on a bridge and crossed over the median of the divided highway, crashing head-on into the Pringles' car.

Two occupants of the other vehicle were also killed, but have not been identified as of Monday, police said.

The Pringles were well-known in the Cornwall area for their dedication to community and church work. Both were active with the St. John's Ambulance organization and were also involved with the local Air Cadets training program. Both were members of St. John Presbyterian Church in Cornwall, where he was an elder and she sang in the choir. The couple had no children.

Brent Pringle, who attended Huntingdon Academy and Chateaugay Valley Regional High School (Class of 1977), worked for a Morrisburg, Ont. firm which manufactures prefabricated

soundproof rooms. Natalie Pringle was a computer programmer for a Cornwall company.

Brent Pringle is survived by his parents Osborne and Jean Pringle of Huntingdon, a sister Laurie (Donnie Tannahill) and a brother Kevin. He was pre-deceased by another brother, Dale.

Funeral arrangements will be announced shortly.
