Woman killed in watercraft mishap

A 32-year-old St-Anicet woman died when her personal watercraft struck a steel post in Lac St-François on the afternoon of Thursday June 7.

According to an officer of the Haut-St-Laurent SQ, Nathalie Brunet tried to restart the motor of the craft after attaching the anchor cable. When the engine revved unexpectedly, seemingly because the cable became entangled with the vehicle's throttle, she was sitting sideways on the seat. The craft sped out of control and hit the post near the adjacent wharf. The accident occurred not far from the woman's home at 196 - 146th Ave.

The victim was thrown into the water by the impact. Her husband pulled her from the lake and tried to revive her. When the ambulance arrived, she was taken to the Suroît Regional Hospital in Valleyfield where she was declared dead on arrival as a result of a broken back and possible internal hemorrhaging. A Coroner's inquest will be held, police said.

Identity confirmed

Meanwhile, police confirmed this week that the woman killed in a single-car accident last week in Hinchinbrooke was 39-year-old Chantal Dumas, co-owner of the Ormstown Golf Course. She died when her car struck a tree on the Gowan Road and burned. Police said she had swerved to avoid a deer. (PI/JT)
