One dead in two-car crash

One person died and five other people were injured in a Friday afternoon collision at the intersection of the Montée Bryson and the Fifth Range near Ormstown.

A missing Stop sign at the intersection is believed to have caused the crash, which occurred when one vehicle failed to stop and collided with another coming along the other road, police said.

The victim, 24 year-old Frédéric Cinq-Mars of Très-St-Sacrement, was declared dead on arrival at Ormstown's Barrie Memorial Hospital, where he was taken by ambulance following the 2 p.m. accident.

Cinq-Mars, who was driving the small car which failed to stop, had three other people in the car with him. They were hurt, as were the two people in the other vehicle, a mini-van.

James B. McCoy, 87, was loved by young and old in Huntingdon

On July 17, 2001, James Brown McCoy passed away at the Huntingdon County Hospital, at the age of 87.

Born the second son of the late E. C. McCoy and his wife, the late Edna Brown, he completed his high school education at the Academy, and then spent 39 years as a merchant in Huntingdon.

He was married for 61 years to Margaret (Younie), and was always keenly interested in sports, especially football and badminton. Other interests were his church, gardening, travelling, and keeping up with his many friends in the Chateaugay Valley and beyond. He and his wife spent eight enjoyable winters in Florida, where they were warmly welcomed.

Jim held most offices at the Huntingdon United Church, from Sunday School Superintendent to Elder. He was active in the Merchants' Association, the Badminton Club and other groups. He helped many

children learn to water-ski, spending many patient hours until they mastered the skill. He tilled many gardens for local seniors, and gave away most of the produce from his own garden, as well as countless bouquets of sweet peas and other flowers to shut-ins.
