ANDERSON, Marjorie E. - Of 44 Second Street, Malone, New York, died Thursday, October 18, 2001 at her home, after a long illness, in the presence of her loving family. Mrs. Anderson was born in Huntingdon, Quebec. She was the daughter of Thomas O'Connor and Grace Walsh O'Connor. She was a graduate of the Congregation of Notre Dame Convent School in Huntingdon, Quebec. Following graduation she was enrolled in a hazardous chemical training program at Nitro-Quebec in Valleyfield, Quebec. She was then employed and trained as a Medical Technician at St. Mary's Hospital in Montreal, Quebec. Ultimately she was responsible for managing the blood bank at St. Mary's. While in Montreal, Mrs. Anderson attended Sir George Williams College and classes at Royal Victoria Hospital. Mrs. Anderson and her husband, G. Bruce Anderson, were married at St. Joseph's Church in Huntingdon, Quebec on January 27, 1951. After her marriage, Mrs. Anderson accompanied her husband on his military tour of duty and they were stationed at Fort Leonard, Wood, MO, and Fort Belvoir, VA. While her husband served as a Company Commander in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers during the Korean War, Mrs. Anderson resided in Malone. Following the Korean War, Mrs. Anderson and her husband were relocated during his employment with Allis-Chalmers to Cincinnati, OH, Pittsburgh, PA and Milwaukee, WI. The couple then returned to Malone, New York. In 1963, Mrs. Anderson and her husband founded the G. Bruce Anderson Insurance Agency in Fort Covington, New York which they owned and operated until his death. Mrs. Anderson was a graduate of the Ogdensburg Business School. She held a New York State Insurance Agents and Brokers License as well as a New York State Real Estate License. Mrs. Anderson was well known and highly esteemed by the local community for her many acts of kindness and good will to the elderly and to those in need of comfort. Mrs. Anderson taught release time classes in local schools. She was a member of the Legion of Mary, and the Altar and Rosary Society of St. Joseph's Church. Mrs. Anderson also belonged to the American Legion Auxiliary, Women of the Moose, and the Ladies of the Elks 1303, as well as professional associations. Her husband, G. Bruce Anderson, had predeceased her on March 14, 1995. Surviving are her four daughters, Lillian Anderson-Duffy, an attorney in Malone, her husband Frank W. Duffy, Lorraine E. Anderson, a nurse of Buffalo, New York and her husband, Michael G. Kirst, Leigh E. Anderson, an attorney also of Buffalo, and Lynne M. Wareham, an IBM manager of Albany, New York. Also surviving are her grandchildren, Alexander Anderson-Kirst, Aileen-Elton Anderson-Kirsts, and Allison L. Wareham.
