Woman dies after Ormstown accident

A 47-year-old Valleyfield woman died over the weekend as a result of injuries she received when she lost control of her car just after 7:30 Friday morning on Route 201 north of Ormstown. Road conditions were slippery at the time, police said.

The north-bound car went into a culvert on the right-hand side of the road near the Lower Concession intersection, and the driver, Jocelyne Bernard, who was alone in the vehicle, was trapped inside. The driver's side of the vehicle was heavily damaged.

First on the scene was an SQ officer from the Haut-St-Laurent detachment, who called in Ormstown firemen to help extricate the victim using the Jaws of Life. She was taken by ambulance to Ormstown's Barrie Memorial Hospital, transferred to Valleyfield and subsequently to Montreal for treatment of serious head injuries which later proved fatal, police said Monday.
