Fatal accident in Très-St-Sacrement

A 30-year-old Franklin woman was killed in a single-car accident on Route 203 in Très-St-Sacrement on Monday Apr. 29.

According to Haut-St-Laurent SQ officers, Claire-Marie Hampson lost control of her 1989 Chevrolet Blazer, which left the road and rolled over several times before coming to rest in the ditch. The victim was thrown from the vehicle and killed instantly. She was declared dead on arrival at Ormstown's Barrie Memorial Hospital.

Police said an investigation is being carried out to determine the cause of the crash. They do not believe alcohol was a factor, but excessive speed may have been involved. The driver had failed to buckle her safety belt, they said.
