

It turns out that the motorist who perished in a car accident in Godmanchester the morning of Sunday, July 13, committed suicide. Ronald McInnis of the SQ's Monteregie station confirmed to The Gleaner/La Source that, "after a police investigation, we must conclude that this was indeed a suicide.'

Daniel Guertin, 30-year-old a Valleyfield resident, lost his life when he

Huntingdon. The vehicle ran off the road violently and hit a Hydro-Quebec pole. The automobile caught fire immediately and the driver, alone in the car, had no chance to escape. According to McInnis, the police

engulfed the car. A coroner has been asked to shed some light on this deadly accident.
